- THE UNIVERSITY OF FLORIDA

Before being elected department chairman in 1998, my duties at the College of Journalism and Communications included serving as director of the beginning writing course, 1986-1990. In addition to lecturing, preparing the student booklet, organizing the syllabus and creating assignments, this responsibility involved supervision of the course's 18 writing labs and their instructors. After three years, I began sharing some of these responsibilities with a colleague, which allowed me to become more involved in the graduate program.

The Applied Magazine Publishing course I taught 1991-1997 produced *Orange & Blue Magazine*. I created a guide for the course, an 80-page book called the *Orange & Blue Production Manual*.

I was invited by the university administration to teach an experimental freshman seminar in the fall of 1991.

As a member of the faculty for the honors program, I have taught two versions of the Honors Seminar in Mass Media and Society: one as a general survey course, a second as a history of rock'n'roll music.

I have also served UF as adviser to the student chapter of The Society of Professional Journalists, the founding adviser to The Magazine Society, and adviser to the Journalism and Communications College Council.

In May 1990, I was awarded tenure by the University of Florida and promoted to associate professor. In April 1994, I was promoted to professor.

I am a founding member of the American Journalism Historians Association and have served as an associate editor of that organization's journal, *American Journalism*.

While serving as assistant director of the H. H. Herbert School of Journalism and Mass Communication, my administrative duties included course scheduling, coordinating counseling and advising functions, serving as a liaison with the state press and directing internships and placement. I was elected by the faculty to serve on the school's administrative committee, which was responsible for hiring and evaluating all faculty, preparing the school's budget and other administrative chores.

One of my teaching areas was political reporting. I supervised coverage of the Oklahoma legislature for the state press association. Students enrolled in my legislative reporting class worked out of a news bureau I managed in conjunction with the press association. The weekly news reports were distributed statewide. I wrote columns for four newspapers during each legislative session.

As another part of my political reporting duties, I organized coverage of the 1984 political conventions in San Francisco and Dallas for the state press association and the Oklahoma City bureau of the Associated Press. I provided four daily broadcast pieces for a major Oklahoma City radio station and the university's National Public Radio affiliate.

In May 1985, I was awarded tenure.

My major research interests outside of those reflected in my major publications are the role of the press in the civil rights movement, the portrayal of journalists in popular culture, the development of American media empires and the First Amendment opinions of the late Supreme Court Justice William Brennan.
